A study based on more than 400,000 people states that older people who receive frequent visits from family and friends have a 39% lower chance of dying.

She is a 62-year-old woman. Let's call her Maria. She lives in the United States and has a night job, which makes socializing a little difficult. Yesterday she went to bed at 4:00 a.m. and today she woke up at 9:00 a.m. She turns on the television; a religious show is on. That is fine with her. Maria watches a lot of TV. She has no children or close friends. She is not particularly sociable, so she fills her days with shows, reality programs, newscasts, and movies —other people's lives. Suddenly it is 5:45 p.m., so she makes some dinner. After that she cleans the house and rests a little. Oh, it's late. She showers quickly and gets ready. It's 10:45 p.m. and she has to leave for work.

This could have been yesterday, last week or any day, really. That is simply her routine. Maria's health is reasonably good, but she is not happy. Her level of happiness is two out of ten.

In these 20 years, loneliness has become a much more common experience and loneliness kills. So, the most important thing is to see family and close friends at least once a month. It doesn't matter if it is one visit a month, a week, or every day. One has to be sociable, yes, but it is not necessary to be too sociable.

Rosa Parks was an important person in American history. Although a law in 1863 said slaves were free, Black people were discriminated against in the United States, especially in the southern states. They had to go to different schools and sit in the back seats of public buses. African Americans also could not eat in the same restaurants as White people.

Rosa Parks was born on February 4, 1913. On December 1, 1955, she got on a city bus in Montgomery, Alabama. She sat where Black people could sit, but when the bus got crowded, the driver told her to give up her seat to a White person. Rosa said no, and the police arrested her.

After Rosa's arrest, Black people in Montgomery joined together and decided not to use the city buses for over a year. This was called the Montgomery Bus Boycott. It caused problems for the city because they lost money when people did not use the buses. The boycott ended in 1956, when the Supreme Court decided that segregating people on buses was wrong.

Rosa Parks died on October 24, 2005. Her actions inspired other people to fight for the rights of Black people. Her bravery was an important part of the civil rights movement in the 1950s and '60s.

The Tanzanian (0) **government** has installed fast internet on Mount Kilimanjaro, Africa's highest peak. Officials say it is for climbers' safety and to help them share (16) _____ online. Mount Kilimanjaro stands at 19,300 feet, making it Africa's (17) _____ mountain. The mountain is located in Kilimanjaro National Park. It attracts (18) _____ 50,000 visitors each year and, out of these, 35,000 try to climb it.

Climbing the glacier-covered mountain is difficult, and one-third of climbers decide not to (19) _____ the climb. Tanzania's information minister, Nape Nnauye, noted the past danger for visitors without (20) _____ access. The new service is designed to help climbers with navigation and emergencies.
