The world's top airports

Text 0

Doha Hamad International Airport is the international airport for Doha, the capital city of Qatar. The airport has been described as the most architecturally significant terminal complex in the world, as well as being the most luxurious. It is the central airport for Qatar Airways.

Text 1

Tokyo Haneda International Airport is one of the world's busiest airports and is Japan's busiest airport being located less than 30 minutes south of central Tokyo. It already won the "Airport of the Year" title at the World Airport Awards. The airport has not just one but three terminals: Terminal 1, Terminal 2 and the international Terminal 3.

Text 2

Munich Airport has been in the top ten airports for the last three years. It is the second busiest airport in Germany and the secondary centre of operations for Lufthansa German Airlines. With over 150 stores and some 50 places where you can eat and drink, it's like a city centre, offering travellers and visitors a lot of things to see and do.

Text 3

London Heathrow Airport is one of the world's busiest international airports and is the primary centre of operations for British Airways and Virgin Atlantic Airways. This airport became N° 3 in the world only two years after its inauguration. It has four passenger terminals, reduced to 2 terminals in use during much of 2020.

Text 4

Kansai International Airport has been operating since 1994 and has become an important international centre of activity for Japan, with one of the largest networks for both domestic and international routes with 24-hour operations.

Text 5

Hong Kong International Airport is one of the world's largest airports for both passengers and cargo and is the centre of operations for Cathay Pacific Airways. The new airport (HKIA) started operating in the summer of 1998 and is one of the two most expensive engineering projects in history.
